30 Days of Prayer for Holiness*November 4th – December 3rd***KEY TEXTS:***Leviticus 11:45 (NKJV)*

For I *am* the LORD who brings you up out of the land of Egypt, to be your God. You shall therefore be holy, for I *am* holy.

Leviticus 19:2 (NKJV)

“Speak to all the congregation of the children of Israel, and say to them: ‘You shall be holy, for I the LORD your God *am* holy.’”

Leviticus 20:7 (NKJV)

Consecrate yourselves therefore, and be holy, for I *am* the LORD your God.

Leviticus 20:26 (NKJV)

And you shall be holy to Me, for I the LORD *am* holy, and have separated you from the peoples, that you should be Mine.

Deuteronomy 7:6 / 14:2 (NKJV)

“For you *are* a holy people to the LORD your God; the LORD your God has chosen you to be a people for Himself, a special treasure above all the peoples on the face of the earth.”

Deuteronomy 26:19 (NKJV)

“...and that He will set you high above all nations which He has made, in praise, in name, and in honor, and that you may be a holy people to the LORD your God, just as He has spoken.”

Ephesians 1:4-5 (NKJV)

Just as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before Him in love, having predestined us to adoption as sons by Jesus Christ to Himself, according to the good pleasure of His will,

Ephesians 5:26-27 (NKJV)

That He might sanctify and cleanse her with the washing of water by the word, that He might present her to Himself a glorious church, not having spot or wrinkle or any such thing, but that she should be holy and without blemish.

1 Peter 1:15-16 (NKJV)

But as He who called you *is* holy, you also be holy in all *your* conduct, because it is written, “Be holy, for I am holy.”

2 Peter 3:11 (NKJV)

Therefore, since all these things will be dissolved, what manner *of persons* ought you to be in holy conduct and godliness,

Revelation 20:6 (NKJV)

Blessed and holy *is* he who has part in the first resurrection. Over such the second death has no power, but they shall be priests of God and of Christ, and shall reign with Him a thousand years.

Revelation 22:11 (NKJV)

He who is unjust, let him be unjust still; he who is filthy, let him be filthy still; he who is righteous, let him be righteous still; he who is holy, let him be holy still.”

KEY QUOTES:

It is not a conclusive evidence that a man is a Christian because he manifests spiritual ecstasy under extraordinary circumstances. Holiness is not rapture: it is an entire surrender of the will to God; it is living by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God; it is doing the will of our heavenly Father; it is trusting God in trial, in darkness as well as in the light; it is walking by faith and not by sight; it is relying on God with unquestioning confidence, and resting in His love. EGW, *Acts of the Apostles*, 51.2

The work of transformation from unholiness to holiness is a continuous one. Day by day God labors for man's sanctification, and man is to co-operate with Him, putting forth persevering efforts in the cultivation of right habits. He is to add grace to grace; and as he thus works on the plan of addition, God works for him on the plan of multiplication. Our Saviour is always ready to hear and answer the prayer of the contrite heart, and grace and peace are multiplied to His faithful ones. Gladly He grants them the blessings they need in their struggle against the evils that beset them. EGW, *Acts of the Apostles*, 532.2

GUIDELINES:

1. Prayerfully identify at least two or three areas of your life which you would like Christ's holiness to transform during the 30 Days of Prayer
2. Set aside 15 – 30 minutes each day to consecrate your life to God and seek Him for holiness in your character.
3. Set aside one day each week to fast (personal health permitting) for God to give you victory over the flesh, addictions, un-Christlike attitudes, unhealthy habits and practices.

4. Select a prayer group of about 3 – 5 persons with whom you will prayer at least three times weekly during the 30 Days of Prayer.
5. Read and reflect on the daily recommended Scriptural passages. Use these readings to inform your daily prayers.
6. If you have young children, adolescents, our youth in your homes, make this 30 Days experience a family experience. Be creative. Adapt this initiative to the specific make up or needs of your family.
